Leonard Rubenstein is Professor of the Practice in the Department of Epidemiology at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, and Director of the Program in Human Rights, Health and Conflict. He is also a core faculty member the Berman Institute of Bioethics and the Center for Humanitarian Health at Johns Hopkins University. Prior to coming to Johns Hopkins in 2009, he was a Jennings Randolph Senior Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace, and before that Executive Director of Physicians for Human Rights and Executive Director of the Judge David Bazelon Center for Mental Health Law.

Professor Rubenstein has written extensively on the problem of violence against health care in war and founded and chairs the Safeguarding Health in Conflict Coalition. His book, Perilous Medicine: The Struggle to Protect Health Care from the Violence of War, will be published in 2021. He has appeared before Congress, the World Health Assembly and the UN Security Council. He has a J.D. from Harvard Law School and LL.M. from Georgetown Law School.
